¹ WFP Partners distributed 15 kg of flour to 1,306,580 people, which is equivalent to 100 grams bread per person per day. The number of WFP beneficiaries is calculated as 30% of WFP beneficiaries (391,974 BNFs) in the gaps analysis considering the amount of bread equal to 30% minimum daily requirement.

Situation Update

- **3.07 million people (including IDPs) received bread from 26 FSL partners in 34 sub-districts (SDs) in NW Syria.**
- **242,5K people in 6 SDs (Sarmin, Ras Al Ain, Suluk, Tell Abiad, Ein Issa and Arima) were not reached out from FSL partners' bread distributions.**
- **Bread distributions reached out less than 25% beneficiaries vs. people's needs in 14 SDs (in green color), and less than 50% vs people's needs in 4 SDs (in yellow).**
- Bread distribution reached a number of beneficiaries that was **higher than the people's needs in 12 SDs.**
- **The average price of 1 kg subsidized and unsubsidized bread in NWS was 616 SYP and 1,250 SYP respectively.**
- **The price of imported flour reached 335 USD/MT, while the price of local flour was 299 USD/MT.**
- **The bakery functionalities vary across the governorates in NW Syria: 24% and 13% of bakeries were closed in Aleppo and Idleb respectively, while 8% and 23% are fully functional in the two Governorates.**

**The represented percentages in circles on the map (page 1) refer to the availability of bread by calculating the gap between the actual bread production against the daily bread needs of the population at the sub-district level, which is 330 grams per person per day as minimum daily bread quantity.*

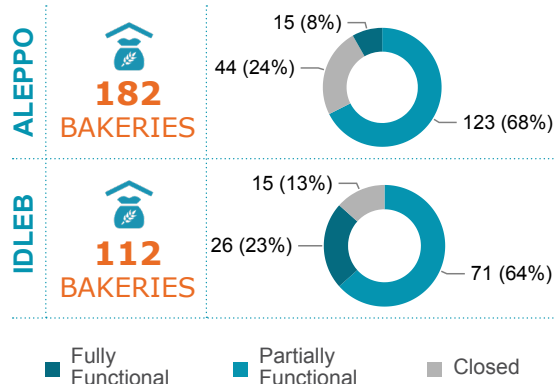
***Colored bars on the map refer to the type of produced bread: subsidized, unsubsidized, and free bread which distributed by NGOs.*

****The price of un-subsidized bread is considered an unaffordable price.*

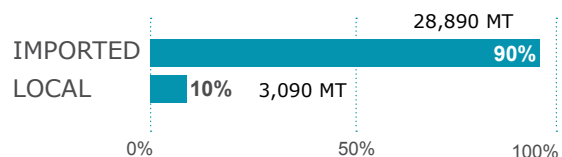

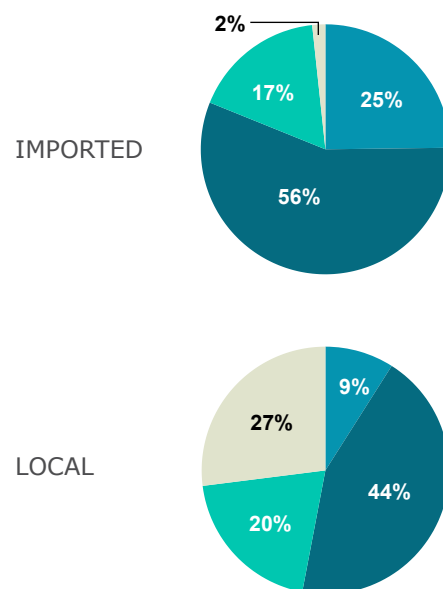

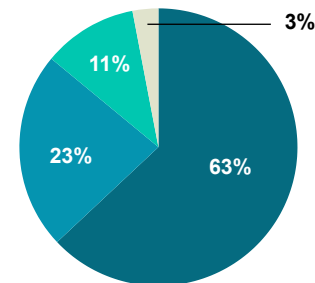

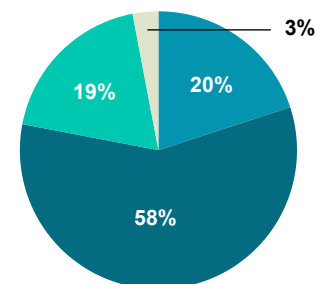

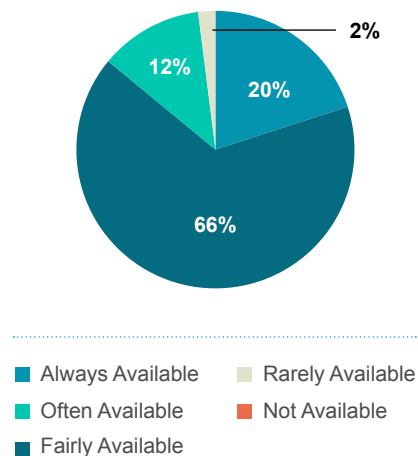

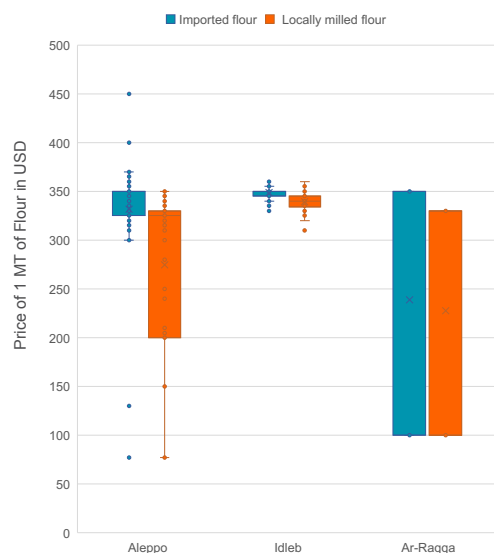

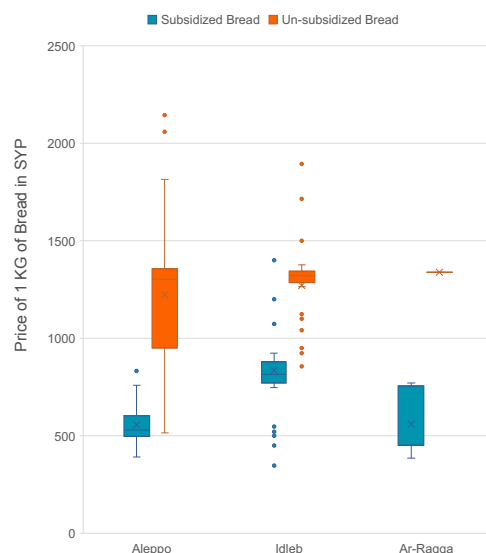

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Quarterly Trend Analysis (2021 Q1 – Q2) on Bread & Bakery Assistance by FSL Partners in NWS

• **1.87M people** will receive bread from 17 FSL partners based on the distribution plans for September 2021. However, plans for the next two months point out a **sharp reduction** of bread beneficiaries (839K in October and 789K in November).

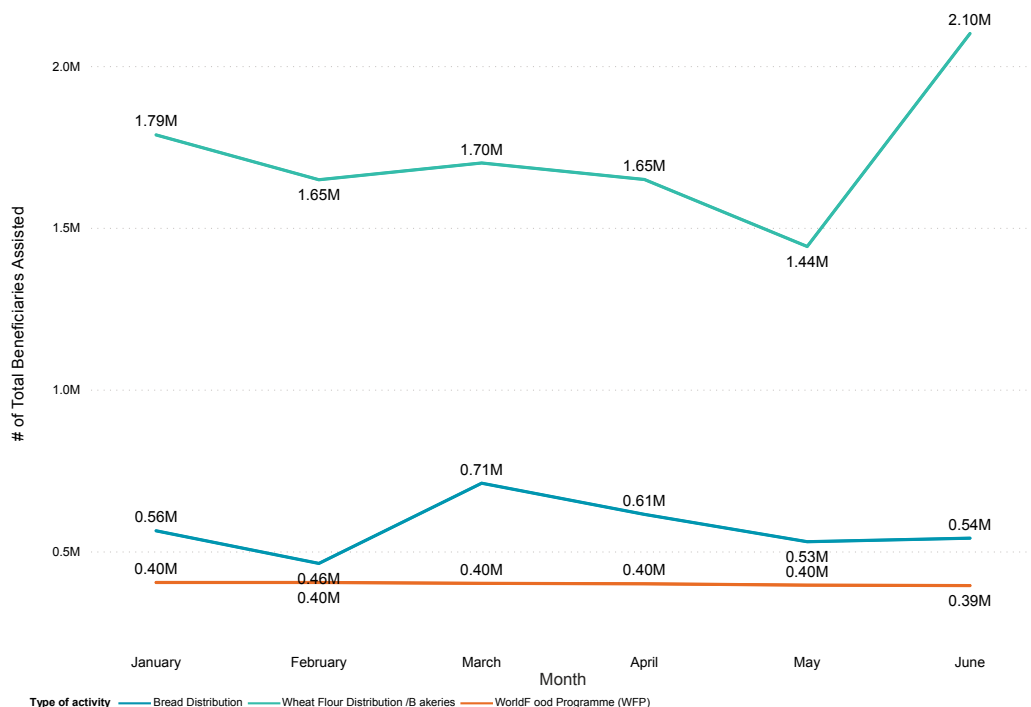
• **Daily bread production decreased** from March to June 2021 in Aleppo (from 570 to 386MT) and Ar-Raqqa (34 to 19MT), while **production increased in Idlib Governorate** from 439 to 522MT. Wheat flour distribution to bakeries for bread hiked over Q2 reaching 2.1M beneficiaries in June.

• The sources of flour show some changes over the last two quarters. The **imported flour** increased from 84% in March to 90% in June, the **local flour** declined from 16% to 10% during the same period of time.

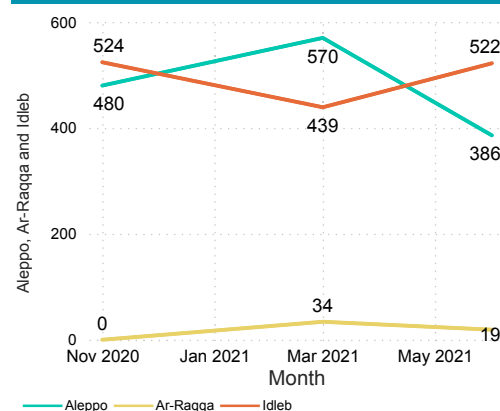
• **Subsidized and unsubsidized bread prices** dropped in Q2 compared with Q1: the prices decreased from 855 SYP to 616 SYP, and from 1594 SYP to 1250 SYP for 1 kg of subsidized and unsubsidized bread respectively.

• **No significant variations were reported** in the price of flour between Q1 and Q2 for imported and local flour.

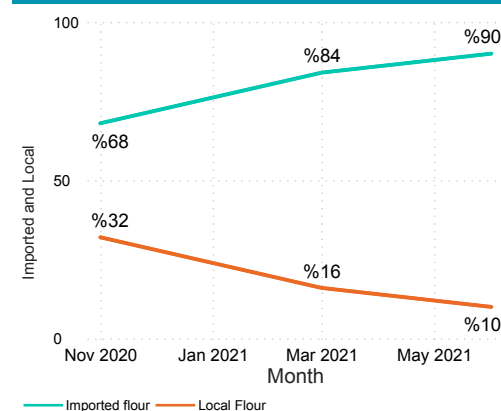
Of Total Beneficiaries Assisted By Bread / Flour Distribution - Q2 2021



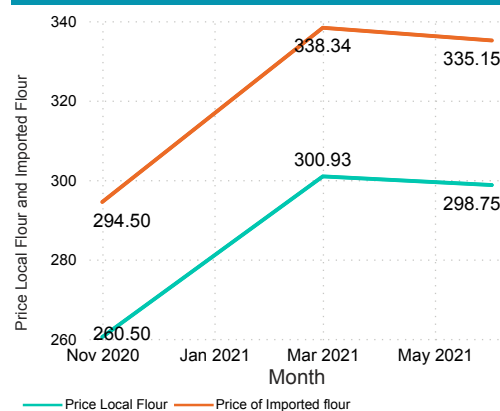
Daily Production of Bread (MT)



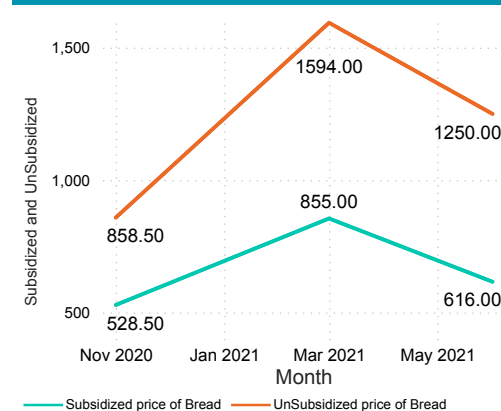
Source of Flour in NWS



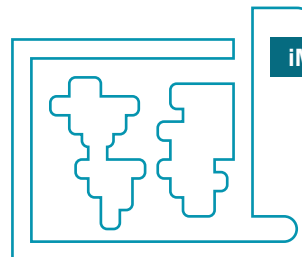
Price of 1 MT of Flour in NWS (USD)
