

Information Management Support to Sectors Under GIFMM in Colombia



Context



Nearly 2.9 million Venezuelan migrants and refugees have fled to Colombia in recent years, with the crisis in Venezuela showing no signs of resolution. The continuous influx has led to the expansion of informal settlements, intensifying the need for coordinated humanitarian responses. The Response for Venezuela (R4V) and the Mixed Migration Flows Interagency Group (GIFMM) were established in November 2019 under the Refugee and Migrant Response Plan (RMRP) for 2020. This strategic framework is crucial for synchronizing efforts across various sectors, including Food Security and Nutrition (led by WFP, FAO, and UNICEF), WASH (UNICEF and Action Against Hunger), Education (UNICEF, NRC, Save the Children), Socio-Economic Integration (IOM, UNDP, PADF), and Health (PAHO/WHO, Ministry of Health). Within the GIFMM framework, these sectors are supported in tasks related to the RMRP program cycle, including reporting and analyzing multi-sectoral needs assessments.

Community-Based Information Management

Humanitarian planning in the country requires more comprehensive data to make strategic decisions, humanitarian actors need more local information to make operational decisions. In settlements and often do not have the settlement-level information to sample planning and response.

Drawing on the Community-Based Approach and OSM field documents, we propose a methodology for needs assessment, monitoring the response at the local level and linking the affected population to the IM process.
